CYPRUS (Paphos area) 7th to 14th August 2013

This was an all-inclusive family holiday with First Choice to St. George's Gardens in Paphos, Cyprus. Our direct flight to Paphos and back was from Bristol. From start to finish we cannot recommend the experience highly enough. No cooking, cleaning, just chilling out all of the time, a complete break! Mike could not keep still all the time and arranged two morning's guiding (9th and 12th) with Jane Stylianou from Cyprus Birding tours http://cyprusbirdingtours.com/ to catch up with the main endemic / speciality species.

The weather was very hot and sunny all week with temperatures mainly 35 to 37 degrees Celsius. There was some partial cloud cover and haze on a couple of days and was very humid as a result. A few days experienced a most pleasant and relieving warm westerly breeze. Believe me, warm is better than hot!

Birdwatching was generally quiet at the resort only a passing Glossy Ibis (flew north at dusk on 8th), up to 3 Common Sandpiper on the rocky beach, a passing Whimbrel (13th), Yellow-legged Gull, 2 Tern sp (unidentified 13th), Rock dove / Feral Pigeon, Swallow, House Sparrow, Spanish Sparrow, Greenfinch, Goldfinch and Hooded Crow. The highlight was a Pallid Swift (am 14th) which lingered long enough for some photos.

To Holly's delight there were moths and butterflies - including Swallow-tail and Eastern Festoon, lizards, crickets, cicadas and a Praying Mantis. Mike's 2 guided mornings (approx 43sp) with Jane are summarised below:-

Friday August 9th 2013 (0700-1200)

Meletis/White River area, Akamas

Common Kestrel, 9 Chukar, 2 Yellow-legged Gull, Common Woodpigeon, Crested Lark (hd), Cyprus Wheatear, Zitting Cisticola, Sardinian Warbler, Masked Shrike (1fem), Western Jackdaw, Hooded Crow, House Sparrow.

Kathikas

On the roadside outside the village we saw a European Roller on wires.

Arodes

In the valley outside the village we saw 3+ Common Kestrel, 2 Eurasian Turtle Dove, 2 European Roller, Zitting Cisticola, Sardinian Warbler, 1 Woodchat Shrike, 4+ juv Masked Shrike, Eurasian Magpie, Western Jackdaw, European Goldfinch, Common Linnet.

Area behind Neo Chorio village/Smygies area, Akamas

Long-legged Buzzard, Common Kestrel, Chukar (c20), Common Woodpigeon, Eurasian Collared Dove, Eurasian 2 Turtle Dove, 1 Red-rumped Swallow, 2 juv and 1 fem Cyprus Wheatear, 1+ Eastern Olivaceous Warbler (hd), Sardinian Warbler (2+hd and 2 seen), Great Tit, Lesser Grey Shrike, 2 juv Masked Shrike, 20+ European Greenfinch. Finally as we left the area it was pleasing to find a male Cretzschmar's Bunting.

Baths of Aprhodite, Polis Chrysochou Bay

We finished the day with c40 Glossy Ibis migrating west over bay and an Isabelline Wheatear in between the farm field clods!

Monday August 12th 2013 (0700-1200)

Paphos Headland

The heat was already oppressive early as we picked out 5 Greater Sand Plover (1 in partial breeding plumage) on the rock shore together with 1 Common Sandpiper, 1 Common Kingfisher and 4 Crested Lark.

Paphos Sewage Works

We drove the tracks around the works and noted 2+ Common Kestrel, 3 Black Francolin including close views of a fine male, 8+ Spur-winged Lapwing, 1 Gull-billed Tern, 1 White-winged Black Tern, Common Woodpigeon, Eurasian Collared Dove, 2 Eurasian Turtle Dove, 20+ Barn Swallow, 5+ Yellow Wagtail, 1 Black-headed Wagtail, 4+ Zitting Cisticola, 3 Sardinian Warbler, Great Tit, Masked Shrike (1 juv), 20+ Western Jackdaw, 50+ Hooded Crow, 30+ House Sparrow. Also numerous Long-tailed blue and Clouded Yellow butterflies

Asprokremmos Dam including car park and utility area and former Aspro Pools area

We enjoyed a coffee in the shade at the dams and also watched the manoeuvres of a helicopter attempting practicing runs scooping up water in a cradle, presumably in readiness for fire fighting. Unsurprisingly birds were a bit harder to come by as a result! We did however briefly see a female Cyprus Warbler, 4 Eurasian Hoopoe and several Sardinian Warblers. We then moved to the area known as Aspro Pools which was unfortunately dry, but saw a Long-legged Buzzard fly over ignoring 2 chasing Common Kestrel, 2 Chukar, Eurasian Stone Curlew (1 hd), 10+ Barn Swallow, 2 Spectacled Warbler, 8+ Sardinian Warbler, Great Tit, 2 Masked Shrike, European Greenfinch and European Goldfinch. Several other Cyprus Warbler including a male were only briefly seen and 2 others heard and most frustrating to locate in the vicinity of the pumping station. It was worth running the gauntlet of the local bee hives though!

A Eurasian Hobby flew over.

We finished the morning off with 2 Common Swift flew over and thanks to Jane for a most enjoyable 2 sessions!
